Please respect the prayerful atmosphere of this holy place. We ask that you turn off all cell phones and electronic devices. Thank you.



#### First Reading: 1 Kings 3:5-12

Because Solomon did not ask for long life, riches, or the defeat of his enemies, God gave him what he asked for: wisdom to govern the people well.

<sup>5</sup> At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream at night. God said, "Ask. What should I give you?"

<sup>6</sup> And Solomon replied, "You have shown great and faithful love to your servant, my father David, because he walked before you in faithfulness, righteousness, and integrity. You have continued this great and faithful love for him by giving him a son to sit on his throne, as it is today.

<sup>7</sup> "Lord my God, you have now made your servant king in my father David's place. Yet I am just a youth with no experience in leadership.<sup>8</sup> Your servant is among your people you have chosen, a people too many to be numbered or counted. <sup>9</sup> So give your servant a receptive heart to judge your people and to discern between good and evil. For who is able to judge this great people of yours?"

<sup>10</sup> Now it pleased the Lord that Solomon had requested this. <sup>11</sup> So God said to him, "Because you have requested this and did not ask for long life or riches for yourself, or the death of your enemies, but you asked discernment for yourself to administer justice, <sup>12</sup> I will therefore do what you have asked. I will give you a wise and understanding heart, so that there has never been anyone like you before and never will be again.

#### Psalm 119:129-136

<sup>129</sup> Your decrees are wondrous; therefore I obey them.

<sup>130</sup> The revelation of your words brings light and gives understanding to the inexperienced. <sup>131</sup> I open my mouth and pant because I long for your commands.

# <sup>132</sup> Turn to me and be gracious to me, as is your practice toward those who love your name.

<sup>133</sup> Make my steps steady through your promise; don't let any sin dominate me.

- <sup>134</sup> Redeem me from human oppression, and I will keep your precepts.
- <sup>135</sup> Make your face shine on your servant, and teach me your statutes.
- <sup>136</sup> My eyes pour out streams of tears because people do not follow your instruction.

#### Second Reading: Romans 8:26-39

These words celebrate the depth of God's actions for us. Through Christ's death for us and the activity of the Spirit praying for us, we are fused to God's love poured out in Jesus Christ. Nothing, not even death itself, is able to separate us from such incredible divine love.

<sup>26</sup> In the same way the Spirit also helps us in our weakness, because we do not know what to pray for as we should, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with inexpressible groanings.
<sup>27</sup> And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because he intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

<sup>28</sup> We know that all things work together for the good of those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. <sup>29</sup> For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, so that he would be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. <sup>30</sup> And those he predestined, he also called; and those he called, he also justified; and those he justified, he also glorified.

<sup>31</sup> What, then, are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? <sup>32</sup> He did not even spare his own Son but gave him up for us all. How will he not also with him grant us everything<sup>? 33</sup> Who can bring an accusation against God's elect? God is the one who justifies. <sup>34</sup> Who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is the one who died, but even more, has been raised; he also is at the right hand of God and intercedes for us. <sup>35</sup> Who can separate us from the love of Christ? Can affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? <sup>36</sup> As it is written: Because of you we are being put to death all day long; we are counted as sheep to be slaughtered.

<sup>37</sup> No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. <sup>38</sup> For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup> nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

<sup>47</sup> "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a large net thrown into the sea. It collected every kind of fish, <sup>48</sup> and when it was full, they dragged it ashore, sat down, and gathered the good fish into containers, but threw out the worthless ones. <sup>49</sup> So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will go out, separate the evil people from the righteous, <sup>50</sup> and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

<sup>51</sup> "Have you understood all these things?" They answered him, "Yes."

<sup>52</sup> "Therefore," he said to them, "every teacher of the law who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom treasures new and old."
